

## Barcoo Shire Council - Jundah

### Introduction

Like many councils today, Queensland's Barcoo Shire Council had set itself environmental goals in order to become a more sustainable council and identified solar energy as a key component of its environmental strategy. The council believed they had a key role to play in informing the community about climate change and recognised that solar power was an effective and highly visible way to get the message across – while reducing their own carbon footprint in the process.



### Opportunity

Ingenero's Solar Challenge, aiming to have 20 councils generating their own renewable energy by 2010, provided the perfect opportunity to launch the Barcoo Shire Council's commitment to sustainability. The council took up Ingenero's free feasibility assessment and found that utilising their unique Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) was an economical way to make the switch from diesel generated energy to solar power.

### Solution



Under the PPA model the council is able to house the solar installation at their facilities and generate electricity without purchasing the solar generation system outright. They simply pay for the power that is generated onsite and used.

The package included the installation of a 34 kW system at the Jundah Sports Centre and a 2 kW system at the Jundah Administration Centre. Both these systems were completed by Ingenero in August 2009. Over the expected 20 year lifetime of the two systems, approximately 894,494 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> gas emissions will be saved.

Included in the installation was a Ingenero's web based performance monitoring systems, EcoWatt. This state of the art, real time web based monitoring system allows Barcoo Shire Council to access the performance of the solar generation units real time and from anywhere in the world. EcoWatt will also aid the council in teaching their community, staff and stakeholders about their sustainability commitment.
