Firm plugs in to sun savings

ADANDENONG company has joined a partnership to help roll out solar power in the state.

With Victoria leading the nation in rates of solar uptake, renewable energy company Ingenero launched a national installer program on last week, signing its first local partnership agreement with Dandenong's Solar Elec Services.

The company services the greater Melbourne area and has five expert crews capable of installing an average of \$1 million in solar panels each month.
